In the evening, the men are conducting Bible studies for age 13 through adults. The lessons are timely, practical, and thought provoking. We are trusting the Lord to see souls saved this week; some have already come to know the Lord during visitation. Unchurched families are directed to the church our family attends.

YOUNG MISSIONARY: Dayanna is in Panama for five weeks working in Vacation Bible Schools with the Kuna Indians. So far over 700 have been saved. Two and three VBS's are conducted each week by teams of workers from our family church and workers from the States. Evangelistic services are held in the evenings. This is a very primitive area of islands off the coast of Panama. There are no hot showers and sleeping in hammocks is the norm. The Kunas are very sweet natured and humble people and very open to the Gospel.
